Northside Teen Heeds Call to "Share Jesus without Fear"



In morning services on October 2, Share Jesus without Fear author Bill Fay spoke about the sin of silence and the importance of approaching people with the good news of Jesus. In the evening

seminar, he provided training on how to ask five pertinent questions and get out of God's way. Asking the five simple questions provides a way to check the level of spiritual interest a person has while they ponder their own views.

All in attendance were given the assignment to ask the five questions to one person by noon on October 7. One teenager couldn't wait even a few minutes to get his assignment done. Eric David had an interesting experience in the church hallway right after the seminar.

Here is his story:

"I came out of Sunday night's service somewhat motivated. After joking around with Tony Manning, trying to get him to give me his phone, the Spirit really moved. All of the sudden, I knew that I needed to call a random unbeliever and ask him these five questions. Bill Fay had talked about not getting in the way of God. So I went up to

[my friend] Kraig and told him to dial a number of an unbeliever. I called Kraig's friend and we talked for five minutes. I asked him the

first few questions and I was surprised to hear how cooperative and understanding he was. He [answered] that he would be going to hell. I asked if he wanted to accept Christ and go to heaven. We prayed "the prayer" and I told him that if he truly believed with all of his heart then he was forgiven and going to heaven. Kraig plans on inviting him to church. Hopefully he will accept and continue to pursue his daily walk with Christ. Only God knows his heart. Pray for him as he deals with his old friends and behavior".

The training continues on Sunday nights at 6 pm as David Laird leads an ACT class based on the book Share Jesus without Fear. This class teaches how to share Jesus whenever and wherever opportunities arise.

The Five Questions:

- 1. Do you have any kind of spiritual belief?**
- 2. To you, who is Jesus?**
- 3. Do you believe there is a heaven and a hell?**
- 4. If you died right now, where would you go? If heaven, why would God let you in?**
- 5. If what you believe were not true, would you want to know?**

We Need to Stick Together

If any one of these areas is missing in your life, you are not experiencing the full community that Northside has to offer.

Today, membership has dwindled nearly 40 percent. Other service organizations have experienced similar decline. The Jaycees are down 58 percent; the PTA, a 60 percent loss; and the American Red Cross, 61 percent fewer volunteers.

Sociologist Robert Putnam of Harvard University made the following observation: “Americans in massive numbers began to join less, trust less, give less...over the past thirty years civic and social clubs, have fallen 25 to 50 percent. A variety of technological and economic and social changes – television, two-career families, urban sprawl, and so on is to blame”.

The Key to Small Group Growth:

I was recently reading an article in a state Baptist paper by Keith Wilkinson who is the State Sunday School leader in Oklahoma. Some of you may remember him doing a Sunday School campaign here at our church in the mid 90's. This recent article was about the five keys of a successful Sunday School (small group) as written by Arthur Flake.

As he wrote about the key principle of personally inviting people, I was reminded that this is a factor we need to emphasize right now. Look at these points from the article:

* Keith Wilkinson noted that "Sunday Schools [small groups] grow when they understand the principle of contacting and inviting people to experience God's Word in a small group. People respond to people."

* Wilkinson quoted from one of Thom Rainer's books about church growth, "Most unchurched people said they would attend a Bible study worship experience if they were invited!"

* Wilkinson said "Making constant and continuous contacts pays off. Invite, Invite, Invite! Truth is that many Sunday Schools stopped growing because we stopped inviting people to participate."

* Wilkinson shared "Flake's Formula" which says to "1. Know the possibilities, 2. Enlarge the organization, 3. Provide the space, 4. Enlist and train the workers, 5. Go after the people."

Whether you are in a Sunday School class or a small group in a home, we need to continue to look for people who are not in a class or small group.

The principle of contacting works. One year ago, Mark and Kate Ayers took on the leadership of a class that had about 3 couples in it. Kate began calling people. She called people on the class lists who were not attending Bible study, people who had visited the church, people she ran into in worship and in the hallway. Today the Ayers have passed on the ministry of this class to others in the class and they are wall to wall with people because of the principle of contacting and ministering to people.

For the Main Campus Sunday School, the satellite ministry goal was to move people from this campus to the North campus, thus leaving room for growth at the Main Campus. Today we have parking spaces, a few empty classrooms and room in the worship service. This is the time for us to begin to GO AFTER THE PEOPLE. Look for events and opportunities to invite those people who need a relationship with the Lord and HIS church. Go after the people and invite them! They will come!

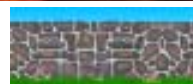
People Respond to People

1. Look in the worship service for those who are not connected.
2. Look in your neighborhood or area where you live.
3. Pray about the people you work with and seek ways to invite them to your class or small group.
4. Go after those people. Contact them. Call them. Write them. Let them know you want them in your group.
5. Pray about when and where you can begin a new group out of the one that you are in. The small group experience is a great blessing, meant to be shared with others, not meant to be protected and kept for ourselves.

Northside Worship and Arts Provides Music for Three Major State Events

This fall has been one of preparation for not just the worship services at Northside, but also for three major events sponsored by the State Convention of Baptist in Indiana. The first event, Crossroads Academy, was held on Friday and Saturday, September 30 and October 1 at Calvary Baptist Church, Greenwood. Our choirs, praise teams, rhythm sections and orchestras from both campuses combined with our media ministry and our newly formed drama team to lead worship for around 375 lay leaders and pastors from Central Indiana.

John Reeder commented, “Our combined worship ministry groups from both campuses, along with our drama team, were a huge blessing to so many people. I couldn’t get away that night for all the people coming to talk with us”.

The same opportunity on a much larger scale takes place on Sunday, October 23. The Worship and Arts Ministry of Northside was asked to lead worship for the Indiana Baptist Pastor’s Conference. Once again, both campuses are joining to provide more than 60 minutes of music that Sunday night. After the Pastor’s Conference, on Monday and Tuesday, our instrumentalists and vocalists will provide music for the State Convention meetings. It’s clear that leading worship is just part of our job description when you see all the ways our Worship and Arts Ministry is serving.



Our own Jim David was asked to do all live camera shoots as well as multi-media presentations for both events. Phil Jacoby has been asked to help with music and also to coordinate and run sound for both events.

We wouldn’t be able to do these things without our set-up crew from North Campus taking the day to deliver and set-up audio

and video for these events.

These opportunities have allowed us to influence the ministry of churches all across the state of Indiana, and even more, to personally encourage pastors, staff, and lay people in their ministries. “I know what it is like to be discouraged in ministry, and then to participate in a worship service where God speaks to my heart and encourages me to keep the faith and continue on in my ministry. That is the opportunity we have,” said John Reeder.

This type of ministry, which can seem like a tremendous amount of extra work has effects that cannot be fully measured this side of heaven. Thanks to all the volunteers who have given unselfishly to make these events a life-changing experience in the hearts of many.



Highland Lakes Baptist Camp, established in 1970 by the State Convention, provides camp and conference facilities for children, youth, and adults in Indiana and surrounding states. It is nestled in the hills of Morgan County on over 400 acres of beautiful forest. Northside’s own Brian Christy is Camp Director while Brent Higgins is Operations Manager. The state government is requiring Highland Lakes to replace the camp’s sewage treatment plant, an extremely expensive endeavor. The camp also hopes to erect a new welcome center using a steel frame building that has recently been donated.
